WHATWILL WE LEARN THIS TERM?

Maths:



PLACE VALUE

- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations
- Find out what each interval is worth in a number line
- Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1,000
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a 4-digit number
- Order and compare numbers beyond 1,000
- Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1,000

ADDITION AND SUBTRACTION

- · Add and subtract numbers with up to four digits using the formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction where appropriate
- Solve addition and subtraction two-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and
- Estimate and use inverse operations to check answers to a calculation













In this 'British Art' unit we will learn how to use a range of media for making portraits: we will learn how to make 'sensory' boxes, create abstract 'cut ups', tell stories in pictures and write memory postcards to create quality artwork that will show our progression in skills. We will also have the opportunity to explore the work of British artists Thomas Gainsborough, Lucian Freud, Howard Hodgkin, Anish Kapoor, Paula Rego and Sonia Boyce.

English:

FICTION-AESOPS FABLES

We will read a range of fables from Aesop's Fables and explore dialogue through drama, debate moral messages and write letters using extended sentences. Finally we will write our own fables.

POETRY-RAINING CATS AND DOGS

We will explore poems about dogs and cats. Investigate form and language and make comparisons. Finally we will write a poem from the point of view of a pet.

THE INTERNET

We will apply our knowledge and understanding of networks, to appreciate the internet as a network of networks which need to be kept secure. Finally, we will evaluate online content to decide how honest, accurate, or reliable it is, and understand the consequences of false information.

In this unit, we will be understanding that mental health, just like physical health, is part of daily life. We will look at the importance of taking care of mental health and learn about strategies and behaviours that support mental health. We will learn to recognise that feelings can change over time. We will look at how everyday things affect feelings and the importance of expressing feeling. We will learn how to express feelings in different ways:





Geography :

OUR EUROPEAN NEIGHBOURS

In this exciting and informative topic we will discover Modern Europe. We will begin to understand the amazing physical and human geography of Modern Europe, learn key facts and explore the varied countries that make up our European continent. We will also develop skills in human and physical geography and further our historical and cultural knowledge of these countries. We will look at selected countries relevant to us to compare with our local area to develop understanding of geographical similarities and differences between different countries and geographical
